HISTORY AND PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

(35 minutes 29 seconds)

1. History and Physical Examination: Syncopal episode. Hypertension.
2. Admission Note: Left lower extremity deep venous thrombosis.
3. History and Physical Examination: New-onset atrial fibrillation with fast ventricular response.
4. Admission Note: Unstable angina. Rule out subendocardial myocardial infarction.
5. Admitting History and Physical: Recurrent atrial flutter. Possible pulmonary embolus. Insulin-dependent diabetes.
6. History and Physical Examination: Orthostatic hypotension. Hyperglycemia. Hyponatremia.
7. Admission Note: Rule out myocardial infarction. Coronary artery disease, status post coronary artery bypass graft. Hypertension. Borderline diabetes mellitus.
8. History and Physical Examination: Organic heart disease. Essential hypertension.
9. History and Physical Examination: Atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease with coronary artery disease and angina. Intermittent atrial fibrillation.
10. History and Physical Examination: Arteriosclerotic heart disease with chest pain and congestive failure. Diabetes mellitus. Exogenous obesity. Degenerative osteoarthritis.
11. Admitting History and Physical Examination: Angina pectoris. Rule out new myocardial infarct. Hypertensive and arteriosclerotic cardiovascular disease with secondary pulmonary edema and congestive failure. Diabetes mellitus.
12. Admission Note: Chest pain. Elevated CPK. Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. Elevated potassium. Asymptomatic carotid bruit.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT REPORT

(16 minutes 3 seconds)

13. Cardiomyopathy. Congestive heart failure. Diabetes mellitus.
14. Sudden cardiac arrest. Severe congestive cardiomyopathy. Anoxic encephalopathy.
15. Left-sided chest pain following a fall.
16. Supraventricular tachycardia, likely atrial flutter.
17. Syncope; possible sinus node dysfunction

(4 minutes 13 seconds)

1. Metastatic colon cancer.
2. Symptomatic umbilical hernia. Fibroepithelial growth of scalp and knee. Hypertension. Diabetes. Gastroesophageal reflux disease.

CONSULTATION (5 minutes 34 seconds)

3. Abdominal pain with epigastric mass.
4. Severe reflux esophagitis with ulcerations. Recent GI bleed. Recent pneumonia with associated respiratory arrest. Inadequate oral nutrition.

DISCHARGE SUMMARY (24 minutes 47 seconds)

5. Symptomatic cholelithiasis and cholecystitis. Myasthenia gravis. Diabetes mellitus. Morbid obesity. Wound dehiscence secondary to steroid dependence.

TRANSCRIPT KEYS

HISTORY AND PHYSICAL EXAMINATION, EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT (10 minutes)

1. Early labor with two prior cesarean sections. Repeat cesarean section and tubal ligation.
2. Twin breech pregnancy, proteinuria, elevated blood pressures, nonreactive nonstress tests. Primary cesarean section.
3. Incomplete spontaneous abortion/miscarriage. Positive gonorrhea culture.
4. Acute pelvic pain.

DISCHARGE SUMMARY (22 minutes)

5. Cesarean section for breech and macrosomia. Bilateral tubal interruption, modified Pomeroy procedure.
6. Menorrhagia. Symptomatic uterine fibroids. Stress urinary incontinence.
7. Endometrial carcinoma. Open total abdominal hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy, periaortic and obturator and pelvic lymph node dissection.
8. Rectal prolapse. Status post laparoscopic anterior resection and proctopexy.
9. Labor at 41+ weeks. Gestational hypertension. Cesarean section secondary to arrest of descent.
10. Labor at 40+ weeks. Spontaneous rupture of membranes. Cesarean section for arrest of descent in direct OP presentation.
11. Uterine papillary serous carcinoma 1C grade 3. Total abdominal hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy, pelvic and aortic lymphadenopathy.
12. Intrauterine pregnancy with preterm labor. Status post betamethasone x2. HIV positive. Group B streptococcus positive. Heavy smoker.

OPERATIVE REPORT (3 hours 21 minutes)

Dilatation and Curettage, Diagnostic Laparoscopy, Hysteroscopy

13. CO2 hysteroscopy and fractional dilation and curettage.
14. Cervical intraepithelial neoplasia 2. Loop electrosurgical excision procedure (LEEP).
15. Cervical dysplasia. Loop electrosurgical excision procedure (LEEP) cervical biopsy.
16. Postmenopausal bleeding. Thickened endometrial stripe. Cervical stenosis. Uterine adenocarcinoma on frozen section of endometrial curettages. Dilatation and curettage under ultrasound guidance.
17. Possible carcinosarcoma of uterus. Examination under anesthesia, dilatation and curettage.
18. Media hysteroscopy. Endometrial curettage. Diagnostic laparoscopic with right and left ovarian cystectomy, excision of endometriosis, and laser ablation of endometriosis.
19. Dysfunctional uterine bleeding, uterine fibroids, endometrial polyp. Diagnostic hysteroscopy, diagnostic curettage.
20. Video laparoscopy with Harmonic Scalpel, peritoneal biopsy and lavage, and dye and insufflation with indigo carmine and pelvic lavage.
21. Premenopausal menorrhagia. Stenotic cervix. Enlarged uterus. Excision of right groin condyloma under local anesthesia. Attempted dilatation and curettage of uterus.
22. Incomplete abortion. Diagnostic laparoscopy. Suction curettage of uterus. Prolapsed uterus, grade 3. Dense adhesions of anterior cul-de-sac to bladder. Hyperextended round ligaments bilaterally.
23. A 12-week missed abortion. Suction dilatation and curettage.
24. Pelvic adhesions and endometriosis, stage I. Diagnostic laparoscopy, laparoscopic lysis of adhesions, and fulguration of endometriosis.
25. Laparoscopic omental adhesiolysis. Bilateral tubal fragment cautery. Excision right tubal mass. Cautery of posterior cul-de-sac endometriosis. Removal, left ovary staple. Hysteroscopic dilatation and curettage. NovaSure ablation.
26. Examination under anesthesia. Diagnostic laparoscopy with chromopertubation and biopsy of anterior uterine serosa. Hysteroscopy/dilatation and curettage.
27. Exploratory laparotomy. Total abdominal hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy. Omental biopsy.
28. Diagnostic laparoscopy with fulguration of endometriosis and peritoneal biopsy.
29. Diagnostic laparoscopy. Lysis of adhesions.

30. Incompetent cervix in 14-week pregnancy. Cervical cerclage.
31. Repeat low transverse cesarean section. Bilateral tubal ligation.
32. Repeat low transverse cesarean section. Breech presentation.
33. Repeat low transverse cesarean section delivery. Lysis of adhesions, extensive.
34. Repeat cesarean section—classical incision on the uterus. Bilateral partial salpingectomy/tubal ligation via Pomeroy technique.
35. Primary cesarean section. Arrest of active phase with nonreassuring fetal heart tracing.
36. Repeat low transverse cesarean section. Bicornuate uterus.
37. Primary low transverse cesarean section. Double footling breech presentation.

38. Exploratory laparotomy with partial left salpingectomy. Left ectopic pregnancy with probable rupture.
39. Pelvic pain. Endometriosis. Laparoscopy and resection of endometriosis.
40. Laparoscopic tubal banding by Falope ring.
41. Laparoscopy. Laparoscopic lysis of adhesions. Laparoscopic ablation of endometriosis. Resection of right ovarian endometrioma.

Hysterectomy and Salpingo-oophorectomy (83 minutes)

42. Exploratory laparotomy. Pelvic washings. Total abdominal hysterectomy. Bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy.
43. Laparoscopic-assisted vaginal hysterectomy with bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy.
44. Menorrhagia. Hysteroscopy. Dilatation and curettage. NovaSure ablation.
45. Symptomatic fibroid uterus. Total abdominal hysterectomy.

46. Laparoscopic right salpingo-oophorectomy and lysis of adhesions.
47. Endometrial lesion. Persistent menorrhagia post ablation. Submucosal fibroid. Laparoscopic-assisted supracervical hysterectomy.
48. Laparoscopic-assisted vaginal hysterectomy. Bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy. Posterior colporrhaphy. Uterosacral colposuspension. Labioplasty. Anterior colporrhaphy. Urethral sling suspension using cadaver graft. Cystoscopy.
49. Uterine prolapse, cystocele. Vaginal hysterectomy, anterior and posterior repair.
50. Fundal fibroid. Total abdominal hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy.
51. Total vaginal hysterectomy, anterior and posterior repair, tension-free vaginal tape sling.
52. Uterine fibroids. Ovarian cyst. Pelvic adhesions. Total abdominal hysterectomy, bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy.

1. Brief Admission Note: Osteomyelitis of right ankle.
2. History and Physical Examination: Degenerative joint disease of left knee.
3. History and Physical Examination: Polytrauma following motor vehicle accident.
4. Short Stay Summary: L1 compression fracture.
5. History and Physical Examination: Herniated cervical disk.
6. History and Physical Examination: Degenerative joint disease of both hips.

CONSULTATION (12 minutes)

7. Comminuted fracture, right tibia.
8. Lower extremity pain. B12 deficiency. Low iron studies.
9. Rotator cuff tear, right shoulder. Right rib and hip contusions.

20. Nonhealing ulcer of the right foot amputation site. Status post debridement.

24. Lateral malleolus fracture of left ankle.
25. Transient cerebral ischemia. Severe iron-deficiency anemia. Diabetes mellitus. Hypertension.

27. Carpal tunnel release. Ganglion cyst of wrist.
28. Closed reduction, comminuted fracture, right wrist, sugar-tong splint. Short arm cast, undisplaced fracture, left wrist.

30. Crush injury of left arm. Debridement and repair.
31. Release of coracoacromial ligament, right shoulder.

42. Diagnostic arthroscopy. Debridement, anterior cruciate ligament stump. Arthroscopic repair of lateral meniscus.

44. Internal fixation, left intertrochanteric femur fracture with intramedullary compression hip screw.
